
The evolution of a local volunteer conservation group





2020 – original aims

- repair broken boardwalk to allow continued public access during lockdown
- cut back vegetation



2023 – new aims


- Replace all remaining boardwalk with new sustainable timber construction method
- Start laying overstood hawthorn to create new hedges
- Restore coppice
- Re-route existing paths to allow for grazing
- Expand reserve to ad 2.5 hectares of mixed woodland
- Embark on 10-year programme of woodland management

drainage works and type 1 limestone laid

Climate Action Grant supports TOE funding to construct precycled plastic boardwalk Mar. 2023

volunteers start coppice recovery and hedge restoration

work starts to repair broken boardwalk

May 2020

Hinksey Trail Regeneration CIC formed

Oct. 2020

volunteers undertake coppicing and hedgelaying training, Climate Action Grant Award

Feb. 2023

volunteers begin project to replace 330m wooden boardwalk
